### YOUR FINAL IMMIGRANT VISA INTERVIEW

You will have received an appointment letter confirming the date and time that you are required to appear at the Consulate General for your Immigrant visa interview. You must present this letter to the Security Guard in order to be admitted to the Consulate.

**All immigrant visa applicants who have received their interview appointment date must register online **BEFORE the interview date**. Please follow the instructions on the following website:**

All members of your family immigrating with you must appear with you on the appointment date. If you **cannot** keep the appointment, please notify this office at once by sending an e-mail to: [ImmigrantVisasAMS@state.gov](mailto:ImmigrantVisasAMS@state.gov) You can request a new appointment using the same e-mail address.

**MEDICAL EXAMINATION:** All intending immigrants, regardless of age, are required to undergo medical examinations prior to the visa interview.

**ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS & COPIES:** You MUST bring with you all original documents pertinent to your case. A summary of required documents is listed below for your convenience. You MUST also bring a photocopy of every original document. Originals can only be returned if presented with a photocopy.

- Passport for each applicant, valid for at least six months beyond the interview date;
- Birth certificate required for each applicant
- Color photographs: 2"x2" format, 4 for each person.
- Police Certificate, required; court and prison records, if applicable
- Military record, if applicable
- Marriage certificate, if applicable;
- Do you not speak English or Dutch? Bring a qualified interpreter. Failure to bring a qualified interpreter means your appointment will be canceled. The interpreter must present a passport to enter the Consulate.
- Divorce decree, or death certificate of spouse, if applicable;
- Evidence of financial support: Form I-864 and supporting documents, properly filled out, signed and assembled for; one form per applicant, required for each applicant for family based immigrant visa applicants; SB1 / DV immigrant applicants may submit proof of financial support or I-134 affidavit of support form; Beneficiaries of employment based petitions should bring a recent, notarized letter from the prospective employer, on company letterhead paper, confirming the essential elements of the job offer.

**TRANSLATIONS:** All documents not in English or Dutch must be accompanied by a certified translation into English by a certified/sworn translator. Incompetent translations cannot be processed.

**Any payment at the Consulate on your interview date must be made in cash, dollar or euro, or by credit card. Pin payments or checks cannot be accepted.**

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE:**

Only after your final interview with the consular officer can a decision be made on your visa application. You must, therefore, not make travel arrangements, give up your job, or dispose of property, etc., until the consular officer has told you that you will receive your visa.
